



Brucefield is a Church of Scotland congregation made up of men, women and young people, committed to worshipping God and serving our community.

Starting as Whitburn Associated Presbyterian Church in 1766, and becoming Whitburn Free Church in the 19th century, the congregation joined the Church of Scotland in 1929 and took the name Brucefield. The present church was built in 1966 and given an 'A' listing by Historic Scotland in 2008.

## ● ● ● | The building

Designed by the esteemed practice of Rowand Anderson Kininmonth and Paul, the main sanctuary and connecting corridor were built between 1965 and 1966. The project and design architect, Tom Duncan, was a native of Whitburn and a long-standing member of the parish. Kininmonth was still the principle of the firm when Brucefield Church was erected.

Brucefield represents the best of post-war church design in Scotland during the 1960s. It was one of a select number of post-war commissions for the Church of Scotland which was emphatically modernist in its conception and was spear-headed in the parish by the forward-thinking Rev W B McMartin.

The site has been particularly well planned, with the swept and recessed entrance providing a focus to the corner. Designed as a courtyard around an enclosed garden, the relationship of new to old is highly successful in recreating a 'cloister'.

The interior is of high quality and well ordered, reflecting the contemporary taste for Scandinavian design, with architect designed furniture including pews, pulpit and font.

The open plan design demonstrates the move to a less hierarchical form of worship occurring during this period, following the principles of the contemporary Liturgical Movement.
